



Standard Set-up Styles

Circle/Semicircle




Circle/Semi Circle: chairs (no tables) arranged in a circle or semicircle with all participants facing inwards

Classroom Style




Classroom: rows of tables arranged with all participants facing towards a presenter
AV equipment available by request

U-Shape/Horseshoe




U-Shape: tables arranged like a "U" with open space in the middle and guests placed on the outside

Chevron Style




Chevron: angled variation of classroom style

Hexagonal Style



Hexagons: tables arranged together creating a single large table with variable seating around
Restricted to certain Spaces


Picnic Tables



Picnic tables: Picnic tables arranged together creating a single table with bench seating
Restricted to certain Spaces



Theater Style




Theater: rows of chairs (no tables) arranged with all participants facing towards a presenter
AV equipment available by request

Cocktail Style




Cocktail: Scattered Cocktail Tables arranged to allow for plenty of wandering room best for Cocktail Events

Rectangular Banquet Style




Banquet: tables lined up in rows, with or without space between, best for receptions and large guest counts

Hollow Rectangle




Hollow Square: several tables arranged in a square with chairs along the perimeter facing an empty center

Clusters/Team Tables



Clusters: several tables arranged in a staggered fashion best for creating small groups in a single space

Conference Style



Conference: tables arranged together creating a single large table with variable seating around
